The apostle John exhorts us to 'love one another, for love is from God.' (1st John 4:7). Here we have the command to love and the explanation that God is the source. God's love has been demonstrated to us through Jesus: 'God sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. (1st John 4:9b-10). 'God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us' (Romans 5:8 NKJV).

Firstly and continually, we must appreciate the love that God has for us. Though deserving of judgment, God the Father sent the Son to pay for our sin and reconcile us with Himself. This was the united mission of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. 'By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent His Son to be the Saviour of the world.' (1st John 4:13-14) The Triune God is not only united in His mission to rescue sinners like you and I, as believers we 'abide in Him, and He in us' so that we share in His mission to demonstrate His love to a lost world.

We receive God's love, and in return we love God and love our neighbour as ourselves (Matt 22:37-39). Receive His love; then respond in love toward God and neighbour! Love is the inevitable response to the love God demonstrates toward us. As we come to appreciate God's love for us; our response is to 'love because He first loved us' (1st John 4:19). Our mission is to pour out the love that God has poured upon us.

Not only is it God's will for all people to have the opportunity to hear of His love for them through the sacrificial death and resurrection of Jesus, but that Christ's sacrificial love be demonstrated through our lives to those around us. John says in 1st John 3:18, 'Let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.' Let us unite our proclamation and demonstration of the Good News so that the world may be transformed through our undivided witness, to the glory of God.



It's been a year since we came to England. After moving into our rented house, we started to get to know the Hong Kong community living around us, meeting people when going to the supermarket, or even as they passed by our house.

We live at the end of the terrace, at a crossroads, so many people walk by every day. Our house is also near to a building site where many Hong Kong people have bought new houses. As these Hong Kong people move into their new homes, we go and visit them frequently. Our frequent visits meant some thought we were also living in their development!

Another way we make contact with Hong Kong people is through using the "Next door" social media app. On the app there is a Hong Kong English page set up by a local minister of the Baptist church. He periodically arranges tours of different places to keep people connected and help Hong Kong people get to know more about Birmingham. We joined these tours and made some Hong Kong friends there.

After we make connections with people, we invite them to have lunch or dinner with us. We always eat, talk and share and finally we pray for them. We had a group of young adults who came too. They need friends and support, and we meet with them every month. Another group also meets in our house on Saturday, most of them are retired.

We also meet fortnightly on Sunday afternoons with groups in Rowheath Pavilion Church. Each time we have simple lunch, talk, sometimes we have a workshop, with playtime for the children running alongside it. We welcome the whole family to come and join with us.



Other than friendship, what these Hong Kong people need most is a job, and to learn English, as fluent English is crucial for finding a job. Thank God that with the help of Rowheath Pavilion Church we have native English ESOL teachers to help us with this.

We have already organised two English classes for Hong Kong people with positive feedback. During each English lesson we share from Bible topics and have discussion questions about these, hoping they will learn more about Jesus.





We have also arranged some special events, e.g. summer Bible classes for children, a celebration for the Mid-Autumn Festival and getting together to watch the fireworks on Bonfire Night.

In November, we started prayer groups. One is for women who share with and pray for each

other. Another group is praying for the setup of worship for these Hong Kong people.

After a whole year living in England, we are thankful for being able to come here, for being accepted by the English people living around us and by the church. Saying goodbye to our Hong Kong family and friends was heartbreaking. But we have been able to make some new friends which is exciting and encouraging. Most importantly God is always with us and strengthens us for what we do. We experience God as a good and faithful provider in every single way and every tiny detail.

On Christmas Day 2023, we had an evangelical meeting inviting all the Hong Kong people to come and listen to the Gospel, celebrating Christmas. From January 2024, we hope we can have a place for the gathering of Hong Kong people on Sunday morning to worship, and

fellowship in the afternoon.

6 Go or send: The purpose and value of short-term mission

The purpose and value of short-term mission has a sound biblical basis. Jesus commands us to go into all the world. Starting at home and moving towards the ends of the earth. It was John Piper who said, 'there are three options when it comes to missions: go, send or disobey'. Short-term mission is an excellent way as an individual or as a member of a team to engage in and obey the Great Commission given by Jesus (Matthew 28:18-20).

Ezekiel writes: 'I came to the exiles at Tel-abib, who were dwelling by the Chebar canal, and I sat where they were dwelling. And I sat there overwhelmed among them seven days' (Ezekiel 3:15). Ezekiel received tremendous insight while on-site for seven days with the Jews who were in captivity in Babylon. Short-term mission allows you to experience the value of exposure to and intentionally engage in mission in a cross-cultural situation often amongst a people who are in total spiritual darkness.

In Acts 17:16-17a we read, 'Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was provoked within him as he saw that the city was full of idols.' In this context Paul experienced four things that happen on short term mission:

1. Go: Paul went to Athens,

2. See: 'he saw the city'

3. Feel: being there had an impact on him, 'his spirit was

provoked within him',

4. Do: Paul did something about it, 'So he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons, and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there'.

When you go on short-term mission and see the great need up front and personal, it moves you to do something about it. That may be to pray more, give more or indeed go again on a short-term or long-term basis.

Short-term mission is in the DNA of OMS UK. Over the years many individuals, OMS recruited teams and church teams have been sent out by OMS UK to many countries throughout the world. This may have involved anything from a few days or to where an individual stayed for up to one year. Over the 15 years I served the Lord through OMS I had the privilege of sending, leading and receiving individuals and teams on short-term mission.

You can be involved in many aspects of ministry on a short-term mission trip. These include: practical work, evangelism, medical, encouragement of full-time missionaries and workers on the field, preaching, teaching, sharing, distribution of tracts or other forms of Christian literature, church invitations and the list goes on. Short-term mission is not restricted to a particular age. Over the years, families including children, young adults, mature adults and seniors have served on short-term mission through OMS UK.

While serving as the OMS Ireland Field Leader I received many individuals and teams to serve the Irish evangelical church in various ways including distributing literature, door to door evangelism, practical work, children's work etc. In addition, individuals and teams served short-term at large events such as the pilgrimage at Croagh Patrick on Reek Sunday and at the Fleadh Cheoil week.

Many local church leaders and church planters were encouraged by these short-term missionaries and thousands were reached with the Gospel. Only eternity will reveal all that was achieved for God and good through these endeavours.

Debriefs with short-term missionaries held after returning from their assignment revealed the following feedback:

- It widened their understanding and passion for mission.
- It contributed to their spiritual growth.
 They were blessed by interacting with missionaries, Christian workers and pastors on the field of service.
- They were an encouragement to workers on the field.
- It was used by God to call or confirm a call into full-time mission (individuals and families).
- They gained first-hand experience of new cultures.
- It awakened a zeal for personal evangelism.
- It challenged them to serve the Lord more on their return through their local church or other local outreach opportunities.

Seeing the individual MAPUTO BIBLICAL & THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

Maputo Biblical and Theological Seminary (MBTS) cooperates with evangelical churches in Mozambique through biblical and theological teaching. MBTS is considered a



reference school by many evangelical churches in Mozambique, and currently has 40 students enrolled in their Bachelor Programme, 20 students attending the Ministerial Programme, and 90 students in the Christian Formation Programme. With both day and night classes the MBTS curriculum is focused on Spiritual Formation, Exegetical Theology, Biblical Theology, Systematic Theology and Practical Theology.

The faculty is made up of pastors, church leaders and missionaries In 2023, the Seminary was blessed to have six missionary teachers but several of these have moved on, so the seminary needs to recruit Mozambican or missionary teachers.

Through the Seminary I met men of God who helped open my eyes and expand my understanding to realise that it is not about knowledge alone because we need to see the life of each individual transformed.

The classes helped me to understand certain behaviours and to abandon them. For example, I got rid of things that took me away from God, that stole my time with God even without realizing it, like browsing the internet. That time on the internet was replaced by time spent

reading books that the teachers gave me, which helped in my growth.

The teaching I have received at the seminary has helped me to centre my life, expectations, motivations and intentions on Christ Jesus, in other words, to live a Christ-centred life. Before, my biblical readings and meditations were superficial. I didn't know how to handle the Scriptures correctly, and I had doubts and concerns about the coherence and veracity of the Bible. I didn't have a correct understanding of spiritual disciplines, or of their practice and importance.

Now, I have gained total and absolute confidence in the Bible as the only written word of God. Now, I follow biblical principles with conviction and centre my life around them. I have gained greater understanding of the Scriptures and this enables me to see the One true God, absolutely just and eternal, in all circumstances. This enables me to deconstruct wrong and unbiblical principles, and seek only what the Bible says. Today, I have closer communion and intimacy with God and am becoming a more joyful person, with inner peace and harmony that doesn't depend on my circumstances.

Many young people in the community where I live are not believers. Many are addicted to alcohol and are involved with various kinds of drugs. They need to be introduced to Jesus Christ, through evangelism. Some of them have seen in the testimony of my new life in Christ, that it is possible to change and have a new life in Him. They approach me, expressing a desire to change. In their despair they confess that they have tried to stop using drugs several times, but have failed. They have spiritual questions and problems, especially about the veracity of the Bible and whether it is really possible for Jesus to love and forgive them. The classes I am taking at the seminary give me the tools to respond, to introduce them to Jesus and to share the Gospel. In this way I am applying what I have learned at the seminary to my evangelistic ministry.

One challenge is to show the importance of studying theology, because many people think that theology is irrelevant and of no use to society. So, my prayer request is that God will continue to use the Seminary to serve the Church, to influence society and to win souls for Jesus Christ. May God use men and women to help meet the needs of the seminary so that it continues to equip and train ministers of the Gospel to faithfully handle the word.

Recent years have seen God at work in the west of Ireland extending His kingdom. Ireland is a spiritually needy country: less than 1% are evangelical Christians and many towns are without Gospel-centred churches. Yet we have seen an increasing interest in the Gospel of Jesus Christ with men and women coming to faith. The Calvary Mission network alone, (of which Calvary Church Castlebar – CCC is a member) has planted eight new churches over the last 25 years.

Castlebar is in Co. Mayo and nearly 30,000 live in the town and surrounding area. CCC first started meeting in 2013 and has been reaching out by public events and personal evangelism, and building up Christians through Sunday services, Bible studies, and children's teaching. CCC rented a venue in a local holiday park before taking a five year lease of a small building off Main Street. By 2020, it had happily outgrown that venue and it moved to renting rooms at the local tennis club and Scout den. While satisfactory for Sunday meetings this provided little space for children's ministry and no provision for mid-week meetings, children's afterschool club, youth or special events etc. The hope was to buy premises to form a permanent home, especially as the number of people attending had grown from about 30 to around 60 (with up to 15 nationalities!).

A building became available on Upper Chapel Street in the town centre beside the Roman Catholic church. It used to be a shop and extends to over 4,000 square feet, plus a basement and garden at the rear. Finance was raised and God's people gave generously, both locally and as far afield as the USA. The purchase was completed in July 2022 and work started in the autumn with a professional Christian builder being brought in to head up the building work.

The building was stripped back to the bare structure, the original roof was replaced, it was completely re-wired and re-plumbed, a new entrance was created and new stairs, also new ceilings, windows and doors added, a new heating system was installed, the internal layout was altered, a baptistry was provided, kitchen and new lighting were installed and numerous other improvements were made.

Men for Missions heard about this work project through the builder and have sent work teams on four occasions. It has been a privilege to serve alongside the workers there and to enjoy fellowship with them and the church family. We have enjoyed wonderful hospitality and truly made to feel part of the project.

We helped to pull down ceilings and remove tiles and old flooring, fitted new plasterboard ceilings, poured the concrete foundation for the baptistry and emergency stairs, cleared the basement and laid a new floor to part, laid new carpets, fitted insulation and tidied the garden. This was all hard work, but we rest in the knowledge that in our own small way we are helping others to spread the good news of Jesus and to build His kingdom.



The finished building will provide a welcoming reception area with coffee bar and tables and chairs for small meetings. This leads to the main worship hall which will be able to seat 120, beyond which are the PA facilities and baptistry. A new staircase gives access to the first floor where there is a comfortable room at the front for Bible studies and prayer. Towards the rear is a large room for Sunday School and kids and youth clubs. Between the two sits the kitchen which will serve both rooms through hatches. An office and storage completes the first floor. A basement provides the potential for further facilities while a garden at the rear will be much used during fine weather.

As I write, (February 2024) the finishing touches will shortly take place with carpets laid and furniture and fittings put in place. The first service in these new facilities will be at Easter (if not before). How joyful it will be to hear the Lord being worshipped in this testament to His goodness and provision. Give thanks and pray for many more to come to know Him as their Saviour.

My Friend,

My gratitude to God and you is great! I have much to tell you. Our Captivating retreat in November brought healing and restoration to the nearly 100 women in attendance. During the testimony time, Joy* called me to stand by her side, "Jeannine is my spiritual mother. I am a lifeguard where she swims. When I was 18, I was gang raped by six men, and the result was the birth of my first son. Three years later, another group of men raped me, and my second son was born. During this retreat, I have wept as God brought deep healing to my heart." Maria* stood

and said, "My life has been hard. I have tried to take my life eleven times. But during these days, God spoke life into my heart, and I want to love and serve him." Maria is the wife of an ex-prisoner who is now living for Jesus. Another lady whom I led to Jesus 10 years ago on an airplane testified how God healed her heart. "I was born in the worst shanty in Medellín. My mother rejected me at birth, and she took me in a box to her work (in prostitution). I am grateful to God that my deep pain in this relationship found healing at the Cross.

My great joy is daily seeing people receive Jesus as Saviour. Jesus said, "Occupy until I come." For this reason, I continue in Colombia reaching the lost for Christ. In ordinary living, I see that my encounter with someone becomes an encounter with Jesus. A secretary at a health centre prayed to receive Jesus, and exclaimed, "Oh, how I needed this. Thank you! Jesus has come to me in my existential crisis. I told my mother this morning I need God. Today, He saved me."

Some people turn away from the invitation, saying, "I do not believe in Jesus." Freddy was not rejecting me but Jesus. So, I pray for him to come to Jesus. Constantly, I run into individuals who have made the decision to accept Jesus, and I affirm them. Often, I am surprised at what God does.

On 5th January, I received a text: "Good afternoon, may the Lord continue to bless you. I do not know if you remember me. My name is Blanca, and you gave me a Bible. You helped me when no one else did. You prayed with me and led me to Jesus. That day my life changed. You will never know how deeply grateful I am for this. When I was going through a very difficult moment, you came and showed me that God is always there to care for us." I did not remember Blanca, whom I witnessed to about Jesus when hospitalised in April 2021. God follows up on those who receive Jesus. As it says it Philippians 1:6, "And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue His work until it's finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns."

Saturday, we went shopping for groceries for seminary families in need. In an aisle, I met Ana and she gratefully received Jesus. Also, the two cashiers broke into smiles with the peace God gives when we repent. At the stoplight, we saw a woman crying beside her young daughter. And as Carlos said, "Natalia came running to accept Jesus." We asked her, "Why are you crying?" "I have no food." She received the Bread of Life and then a gift of money with children's books all before the light turned green. Mere moments turn into an eternal transaction. Hallelujah. Pure joy.

When we held a Lunar New Year event for Hong Kong people, on 4th February, they then invited another Hong Kong family to come. What a wonderful thing that God has done. Praise the Lord!!





News from the Castros



Dear Friends.

We hope you have had a good start to the year and continue to see day by day God's goodness and direction in your life.

The end of last year and the beginning of this new year were quite eventful for us. On Christmas day, Daniel's dad (also called Daniel) went to be with the Lord. He had been in hospital for a few weeks and was recovering, but a sudden respiratory crisis took his life within minutes. We are very grateful Daniel was able to arrive in Colombia before the funeral which took place on the 27th of December. As sad as it was to say a final goodbye, the funeral was a beautiful celebration of 'tío' (uncle) Daniel's life, doing one of the things dad enjoyed most in life, singing hymns!

Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations. Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

Psalm 90:1-2

The last survivor of the men of a large family of six brothers and eight sisters, uncle Daniel had been drawing closer to the Lord in his later years and became a sort of a paternal figure to all the family who came to him for a word of wisdom and guidance. Hundreds of people attended the funeral, some of whom Daniel had not seen for 20 or 30 years! Despite the circumstances, it was good for Daniel to be with his family around the New Year's celebrations and to preach at his home church. We value your prayers for Velma, Daniel's mum, as she grieves the passing of her dear husband. During January, two other members of Daniel's family passed away!

One of the Scriptures we read at dad's funeral was Psalm 90, a sober reminder of the brevity of our life on this earth. We are like grass of the morning that dries and withers by the evening! (v. 6). Our only hope is in Him, our dwelling place throughout all generation, who is from everlasting to everlasting (v. 2). These two very contrasting realities make the life we live and the work we do for the Lord the more vital and urgent, and with the psalmist we pray: teach us to number our days, that we gain a heart of wisdom (v. 12).

We continue to serve God through OMS by providing member care both for overseas missionaries and those at home. As times change, our mission is responding to the reality that Great Britain is rapidly becoming as much a missionary field as it has been a missionary force, and that there is a desperate need for missionaries 'at home' as much as for those going to other parts of the world. Thus, we are helping to explore ways in which OMS can start disciple-making initiatives within the UK, with some work already existing among Hong Kong citizens in Birmingham and Leeds.

It is exciting and invigorating to see new faces coming to Elmwood church almost every Sunday. Just recently, we started a Discipleship Explored course and hope to see more disciple-making initiatives taking place within the church. In the last few months there have been a few Spanish-speaking people that have come to some of our church activities. We are excited about this and wondering where God might be leading us with this. Pray especially for David* a British man in his mid-twenties. He grew up in Spain, but moved to the UK recently to make a new start in life away from bad influences and a dysfunctional family. Pray that he would find a job, new friends, and God! Pray also for Ana*, an elderly lady from Spain as she adapts to life in a nearby care home and has little to no English! Pray she would find life and hope in God and a family of faith. The world is truly on our doorstep!

Please pray with us for God's guidance and wisdom as to whether the planned missions trip to Ecuador goes ahead this summer, given the present unrest in the country. Please also keep the country of Ecuador in your prayers.

We sincerely appreciate your support and involvement in our lives. Our prayer is that God would continue to be your dwelling place and the source of hope and joy in your life.

Dear Friends,

Spring this year, may be a time with lots of movement, DV; visiting and travelling to different places. Please pray for travelling mercies. In Dutch the meaning of the word "spring" is "jump". It is an apt word to demonstrate that the whole of nature is back on the move, "jumping" into gear and back to life. Are you looking forward to the new life in nature in 2024? Easter is coming soon! Let us likewise anticipate with great longing the glorious day of resurrection when our Lord will come back to this earth.

So where will our itinerary lead us this year? This coming Saturday we will again visit the coal mine region in the east of Flanders, as a follow-up of previous visits. At the same time, we will attend a leaders' meeting in Waterschei, the place of one of the seven mines of Flanders. Also in Waterschei two miners were killed on the 31st of January 1966 due to the violent protests against the forced closures of some mines. One of the Catholic speakers on the Day of Reconciliation of 1st July, 2023, will be at the meeting as well. On that Day of Reconciliation, we remembered that, 500 years ago, the first two protestant martyrs were burned at the stake on the main square in Brussels. We hope to reconnect with this Catholic priest and see what more the Lord has in store for us all.

We continue to seek the Lord's will for some new prayer projects He is showing us for 2024 and beyond. As anti-Semitism is on the rise in Europe, the Lord reminded us of the many Jews that were executed in the 14th Century in the whole of Europe at the time of the Black Death, the so-called 'pogroms'. This project is still in its initial stage of gathering information, getting a small team together, looking for the right date, etc. We have been asked to organise a Day of Prayer during the State of Europe address by the Shuman Centre on 8-11th of May. As prayer partners from all over Europe may be present we would like to propose praying against the root of anti-Semitism in Europe.

Another spring initiative is to visit churches and friends in the UK this year, beginning with a short trip during the school holidays in February to our home church in Kenton, London, and to some friends in Scotland. The problem so far has been to combine teaching/coaching in schools with regular deputation trips. Eddy has reduced his teaching engagement to two days a week. From September onwards he may reduce that further. Fortunately, we have started to enjoy a small pension, but teaching a few hours a week does make a difference. Our next OMS deputation trip is scheduled for September. If you happen to have a slot available in your church, either on a Sunday or for a midweek meeting, do contact us. We will be more than happy to come and share about the mission.

May the Lord also guide you in all your travels in 2024. And should you decide to visit Belgium: welcome! May the Lord be our guide throughout this year!

Space



A few years ago we read a book by Richard Swenson entitled "Margin." The premise of the book was that when reading, margins around the text help us to read more clearly, for without them we would be overwhelmed with words. His point was that in our lives we cram so much in that we get overwhelmed with the fullness of our schedules, rendering us ineffective. We run out of space, and have to rethink and reorientate our lives to once again be fruitful.

As a church we are having 'space' issues in a few ways, however, these are by the grace of God, and are wonderful problems to have! Our schedules are filling up with relationships that we are building in town and connections we have with people around us. The boys are into the swing of sports and friends and we always seem to be driving to a practice or a match somewhere. Our days are filling up with 1:1 discipleship, prayer times with the men in the church, or cups of tea with someone who is going through hard times. Physically also, our room on a Sunday is filling up with new people attending church, arriving after a postcard went through their door inviting them to church, or because their work colleague encouraged them to join them on a Sunday. This last few weeks we have had around 40 people gathering regularly to worship God, with a batch of energetic kids keeping us on our toes and those with new responsibilities finding their feet in service. Space is at a premium.

It got us thinking about space and sustainability. At times we still think we're 23 and full of energy, and not in our 40s with three kids and less energy! Yet, God has enabled us over the past year to share the load with the disciples that He is raising in our church. His church is growing because He is growing disciples by His grace, and as our needs are arising, He is filling them with His people. Sometimes we look around and wonder how we went from two ladies praying in a living room in town eight years ago, to forty people singing the praises of Jesus crammed into a hotel conference room on a Sunday. Part of that has to do with space. Space to wait upon God, and follow what He is doing, rather than try to fill our lives and ministries with activities and effort. To be sustainable, both personally and as a church, we need to rely on God, leaving space to stand in awe and wonder at His grace. Pray as we continue to learn this lesson, and that He would help us endure as we seek to serve Him.

Spring 2024



In January, Philip taught at Emmaus University in Haiti. Emmaus was started by OMS, and they supported Guenson Charlot in his studies and helped to raise him up as a leader. He is now President of the university, and like many of the leaders for ministry training that partner with OMS, Dr. Guenson is an extremely hard-working, godly man. Our partners make many sacrifices to lead for Christ and carry His heart for their own nation. When other educated people have chosen to leave the turmoil and hardships of the country, Dr. Guenson

is passionate about leading a university, where Jesus can raise up leaders to bring transformation in Haiti. He writes recently: 'we found strength and encouragement in Scriptures, like James 1:2–4, which reads, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ... Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." This is the reason we are still here fighting the good fight. But the battlefield has never been so overwhelming as it is today.'

Teaching ministry students in person, rather than online, is always a joy for Philip, but being personally present to stand with leaders, like Dr. Guenson, is also a strategic part of the role of OMS and Philip's team. He had a challenging time there in January, teaching Paul's New Testament letters, while struggling with a stomach bug. The two-week intensive course was challenging to finish, but Walnique (pictured next to



Philip), a lecturer who has translated for Philip before, was a great help. Philip was thankful for the honour of preaching, both in a church and at the university. We are grateful that testing pointed to a virus, rather than parasites, so we pray he will be restored for a long journey, in February, to an island nation in Southeast Asia, to visit two OMS-partner theological colleges where pastors and evangelists are trained. Please pray for protection and health whenever Philip travels. Pray for Dr. Guenson, and many leaders like him who are partners with OMS; serving sacrificially to lead ministry training in hard countries.



Caroline (pictured in pink) in Uganda, prayed hard with Fiona to run a training for new leaders, to start small groups for young women aged 15-25. We are praising God that a few of the trainees were university students, who have grown in Christ themselves through the Bible study and prayer materials in Caroline's Esther Project group. They are now ready to invite other young women into transforming community using the Esther Project materials. This is part of the vision of the ministry — to raise young women up as ambassadors of Christ to their generation.



The two-day interactive training material has a prayer time after each section, because helping leaders to pray is the biggest part of allowing God to fill them with His heart and lead them in ministry. Prayer is the only way that young women will be drawn to Christ and transformed by the Holy Spirit. We were praying that the presence of Jesus would fill the trainees, and in one session the prayer was so powerful that people from outside the building wanted to come in and pray! We thank the Lord and now pray for Jesus to direct each one trained, and lead Caroline as she follows up about next steps and encourages them. Bettina, in DR Congo, has been praying and working hard to share the vision and Bible study materials with leaders. We pray that they will encourage others to be trained to invest in young women through dynamic small groups. Pray that Jesus will fight for young women to have the right leaders and groups they need in Uganda and DR Congo.



Bethany (pictured) is persevering to study part-time and work here in Indianapolis. She is applying for full-time universities to start in August. Pray with us for God to lead and provide for both Bethany and Jasmine, who are working out their strategic next steps after the summer.

Both of us have had a lot of health challenges over the past year and have seen Jesus work for us in big ways and sustain us. We need healing and strength if we are

to do what we feel God has given us. Please pray the Lord of Heaven's armies will protect us and restore us, so that we are not distracted or depleted. In March, April and May, Philip will not travel, and we ask that you pray for our Father to bless a 3-month focus on building our support team. We thank him for the people He will draw in to be part of His amazing Kingdom work by praying and regular giving.

We trust you are well and encouraged We enjoyed having Timothy Deborah and Alisson over Christmas and getting to know Santiago Alisson's boyfriend. He is from a Christian family in Bogota, Colombia, and a second-year student at Rio Grande Bible Seminary in Pastoral Studies. They have all returned to their courses safely.

Recently in February Nube gave us a shock as her heart arrhythmia increased and caused very low blood pressure and so we rushed her to hospital. Praise God, with medication the arrhythmia came under control and Nube was able to convalesce at home. Thank you for your prayers and please pray for her continued healing.

State of Emergency and Internal War

On 8th January a dangerous gang leader was found to have escaped prison, so the Ecuadorian President declared a nationwide State of Emergency giving sweeping powers to the police. Due to the level of violence on 9th January, including a gang holding up a TV station live on air the President declared a State of Internal War, this permits the army to freely hunt down and arrest gang members. Thankfully there were only a few incidents in Loja and the Loja Province and none of the congregation or ourselves have been affected. A traffic light system

was implemented on 23rd January so in "Green" areas all restrictions have been lifted including Loja and other quiet areas of Ecuador.

The only ministry affected is the Friday Bible and

Alternatively, some Christians can look at others' gifts and feel that they are not as important because they don't have the same gift as someone else.

In both cases, we need to remember that God has given us each different gifts, but they are all from the one God. Let us bring glory to Him by accepting the gifts He has given to us and also accepting the gifts that He has given to others.



MEFI Update

Alex and Pati, the married couple that run the MEFI ministry in Mexico City recently sent an update on the ministry to the homeless youths of that city. Here is an abridged version of that report translated by OMS missionary, Brenda Reid:

Brothers and sisters, God bless you. We are grateful for God's blessings during 2023, even though we have faced illnesses and other challenges. I would like to inform you about the activities that took place in MEFI during the year.

First of all, we want to thank God for His blessings and provision through you. Thank you for all your spiritual and financial support, we do appreciate your prayers. Last year, we were able to regularly assist 800 youths in various ways. 28 of these came to MEFI for the first time and 31 of them made a commitment to God over the year of 2023.



MEFI Update - Continued

As you may know, during January, Alejandro (Alex), my husband had a knee surgery. He had was on sick leave for three months, and thank God, with many prayers everything was ok and he has fully recovered. After that, it was my turn. In May, I had gallbladder surgery, I took was on sick leave for a month, but I am still in the recovery process. We are thankful that we can still be at the Drop-in Centre. We are grateful for the support we have received for the chavos and ourselves.

As I have mentioned in previous updates, there is drug called Crystal, that is causing a lot of damage in the chavos' lives. It causes as lack of appetite and lack of sleep, it makes them very anxious and aggressive, so they can't control themselves. Also, it is highly addictive and cheap which make it easy to access. It has been a year full of difficult situations and complications with the chavos because some of them have died due to this addiction, others have been involved in fights or killings among themselves. The saddest

part is that some of them are no longer alive.

Due to this drug, we have had to make changes to our schedule because the chavos were very inconsistent and we couldn't make progress in the follow up we had planned.

As part of looking after them we spend time in Bible teaching. This usually takes place after lunch. We teach these topics from the Handbook of Applied Biblical Counselling. In 2023 we talked about:

- Making wise decisions.
- We are free to do what we want, but not everything is beneficial.
- Forgiving others leads to freedom.
- Inner healing.

We were blessed to be visited by four individuals, who in the past were chavos living on the street. Now these four have their own families and hadn't returned to the streets.

In November, two volunteers started to support us. Alejandra is the mum and Jaya the daughter and after her (Jaya's) fiancé Paco joined them. They are connections of Jonny Forsythe. He invited them to go and see if they could support and they have decided to keep on coming. We give thanks to God for their lives and we hope and pray that they continue to support MEFI.

Our goal is that every chavo will be prepared both spiritually and socially. That they will cling to God and that they will build up a life for themselves away from the streets, having employment and being fully integrated in a family and in the society, free from addictions.

Please keep praying for us and for these precious youths who God loves!


